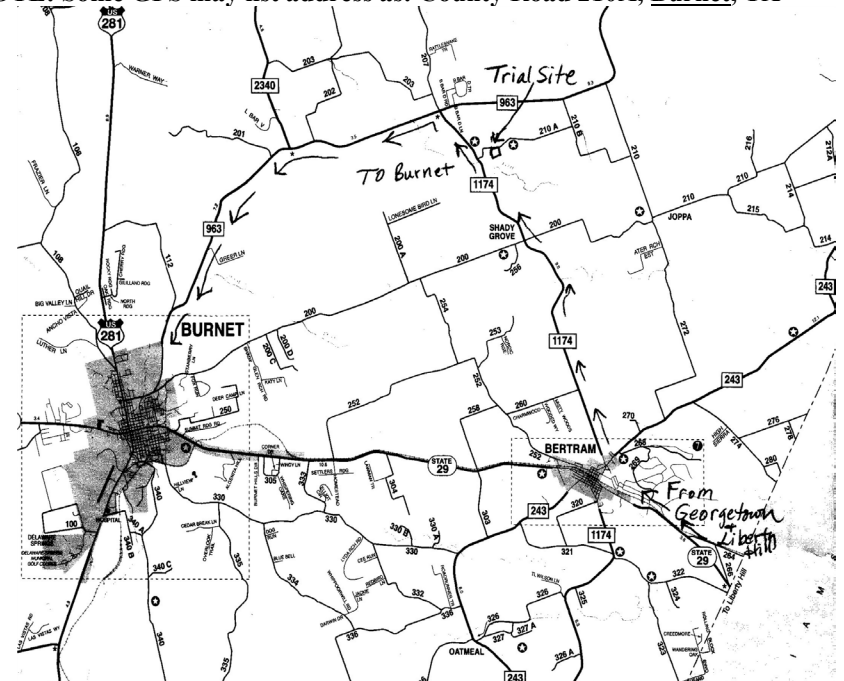

Directions to the Trial Site (From the east at IH 35 at Georgetown) (Towns in order along Hwy. 29 heading west from Georgetown: Liberty Hill, Bertram, Burnet)

Take Hwy 29 to Bertram. In the middle of town at the only signal light, turn North (right) onto RR 243/RR1174 also called Grange Street. Go 4/10 of a mile and turn left onto RR 1174 North. Go 7.6 miles and turn right onto County Road 210A. Go 6/10 mile. The road curves to the left and then to the right. Notice to Exhibitors

- I. **Entry fees will not be refunded** in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by action of the veterinarian, judge, or Trial Committee.
- II. **Entry fees will not be refunded** if the trials cannot be opened or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbance, fire, an act of God, public emergency, an act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.
- III. **Lame dog policy**: If a dog is found to be physically unable to participate in the trial after the closing date, that dog may qualify for a refund in one of two ways. 1) If the trial is full and there is a wait list, and the owner/handler of the injured dog notifies the Trial Secretary at least 24 hours prior to the start of the Sunday trial, the first dog on the wait list that fits the stock availability and can be in attendance, will secure a place in the trial for no more than the number of runs the injured dog had entered, and the injured dog will receive a full refund. If no one on wait list fits the stock availability and/or can be in attendance, no refund will be given. 2) If the trial is not full, all entry fees will be refunded minus any recording fees due. In this case, a veterinarian's certificate MUST be submitted prior to 8:00am the day of the trial.
- IV. It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In that case, no refund of any fees paid will be made.
- V. No refunds for duplicate entries. However, care will be taken to find duplicates before processing. Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms and no entry fee will be refunded in the event of such errors.
- VI. Checks that have been returned due to insufficient funds do not constitute a valid entry and will have a \$25.00 service charge attached.
- VII. Checks that have been post-dated do not constitute a valid entry.
- VIII. Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.
- IX. Destiny Farm reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression, disease, deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dogs' physical or mental performance. No one shall have any recourse or claim against Destiny Farm or any official thereof.

Destiny Farm does not agree to arbitrate claims as set forth on the official entry form for this event.

Eligibility

1. The Trial Program and Junior Herding Dog Program are open to all dogs 9 months of age or older. The Herding Capability Test Program is open to herding breeds and multipurpose breeds with herding background on the list at the end of the Test Program rules, six months of age and older.
2. Spayed bitches and neutered dogs may participate.
3. Bitches in heat may take part. In trial classes, bitches in heat need not wait until all other dogs have participated. In test classes, bitches in heat must wait until all other dogs have participated.
4. Dogs must be sound and in good health. Any dog which appears to be unfit will be removed at the judge's discretion; examples are: lameness, injury, illness, advanced pregnancy.
5. Owners of participating dogs need not be members of any club or organization.
6. A dog owned or co-owned by the judge or any member of the judge's immediate family or household may not be evaluated by that judge, nor may a judge evaluate a dog of which that judge has been the owner, co-owner or primary trainer/handler within the last six months.

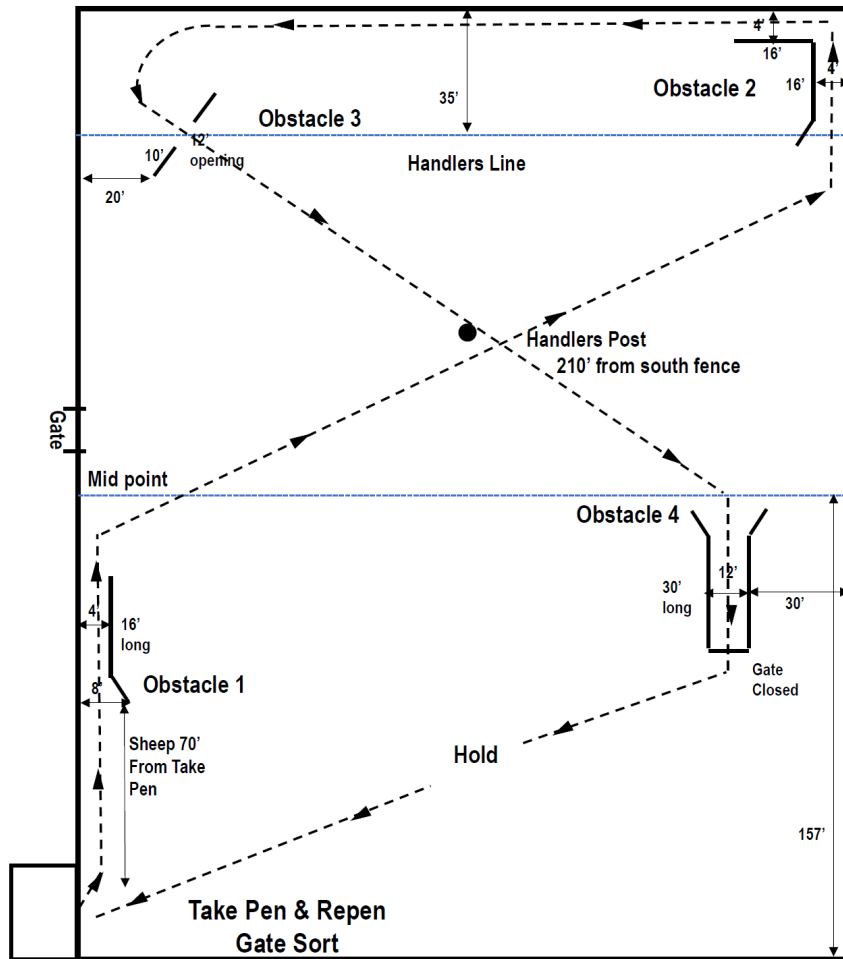
No dog may be entered in two classes on the same course with the same kind of stock under the same judge at any trial.

A dog must be entered in the name of the person(s) who actually owns it at the time entries are made for the Herding Test or Trial.

A Registration or Tracking Number must be included. Use your dog's registration number to enter. If your dog is not registered with any registry, then obtain a tracking number using the form on the AHBA website.

**AHBA HTAD COURSE #5
Description**

Tie Breakers: Best Fetch/Drive from Obstacle 3 to Obstacle 4; then best Chute Pen score, then Time.

A Take Pen is used instead of a set out.

Course Time for HTAD I and II is 10 minutes. HTAD III is 12 minutes. Time starts when the gate for the take pen is opened. In all three classes, the lead is removed before the handler opens the take pen gate.

1. Obstacle I Y chute is located off the West fence, with the entrance built approximately 70' north from the south fence of the arena and is built along the fence on the west side of the arena. The Y obstacle has an 8 ft. opening and the chute part is 16' long. Obstacle 2, L-shaped, is located in the Northeast corner with one panel running parallel to the North fence 4' wide and the second panel running parallel from the East fence 4' wide. Each of the two panels are 16' long. Obstacle 3 is a two parallel panel obstacle located in the Northwest corner built on a diagonal with the lower panel edge at 20 feet from the West fence and the second panel at 35 feet from the North fence. Obstacle 3 is no less than 100' from the opening of Obstacle 4 measured on the diagonal. The opening is 12' wide. There is a handler's line 35' off of the North fence running east to west across the arena. The Handlers post is located just north of the east/west middle line of the arena on the north/south center line approximately 210' from the south fence. Obstacle 4 is a Chute Pen and the entrance is located approximately 120 ft. from the South fence. Chute panels are 12' apart, and located 30' from the East fence and each side of the chute is 30' long. There are two wings at the top entrance and a closed gate at the bottom exit. The hold area is located approximately in the center of the arena just south of Obstacle 4 halfway to the reopen gate. The gate sort is located at the reopen gate for Level III. Two head will be sorted out.

2. Take Pen: HTAD III handlers must remain outside the pen while the dog brings out the stock. HTAD II handlers may enter the pen with the dog but should not move the stock themselves. HTAD I handlers may enter the pen and assist the dog in moving the stock. If the stock come out on their own volition without the handler or dog entering,

there is no penalty. Once the gate to the take pen is opened, it may not be closed until the stock have exited. The stock are then taken toward Obstacle 1. Scoring for the take pen ends when the stock have gone to the midpoint toward Obstacle 1.

3. Obstacle 1: The stock are taken to the Y Chute and put through the obstacle. Handlers may be no further than 10ft. from the opening. Scoring for Obstacle 1 begins at the end of the take pen and ends when the stock exit the Y chute toward Obstacle 2. Drive: After the stock exit Obstacle 1, they are moved toward the Northeast toward Obstacle 2. HTAD III handlers must remain at the exit of Obstacle 1 until the stock have passed the Handler Post on the south side of the cone and then can proceed anywhere behind the Handler's line. HTAD II handlers may accompany the stock to the handler's line to Obstacle 2, then must remain behind the handlers line for the rest of the drive. HTAD I handlers may accompany the stock up to Obstacle 2 but cannot go through obstacle. The drive ends when the stock reach a point 10 ft. in front of Obstacle 2.

4. Obstacle 2: The handlers remain at the designated locations while the stock are taken/driven to and through the L-shaped obstacle which is on the fence line at the Northeast corner, entering at the South side and exiting to the North and West. While HTAD I handlers may go up to the panel, they should not precede the stock through the panel. Once the stock have exited, handlers are free to move along their handlers line except for Level I handlers who can move anywhere. Obstacle 2 ends when all of the stock have exited the obstacle.

5. Obstacle 3: The stock are turned and fetched/driven to the West to Obstacle 3 along the North fence passing the top panel and then turned/driven through the middle of the two panels toward the Southeast to Obstacle 4. Handlers remain behind their Handler's line except for HTAD I handlers who can move anywhere. Scoring for Obstacle 3 ends when the stock have exited the Obstacle.

6. Obstacle 4 (Chute Pen): The stock are fetched/driven Southeast passing to the north side of the Handlers Post to the winged entrance and fetched/driven through the obstacle. The end of the chute has a closed gate. Handlers are free to accompany the stock to the obstacle

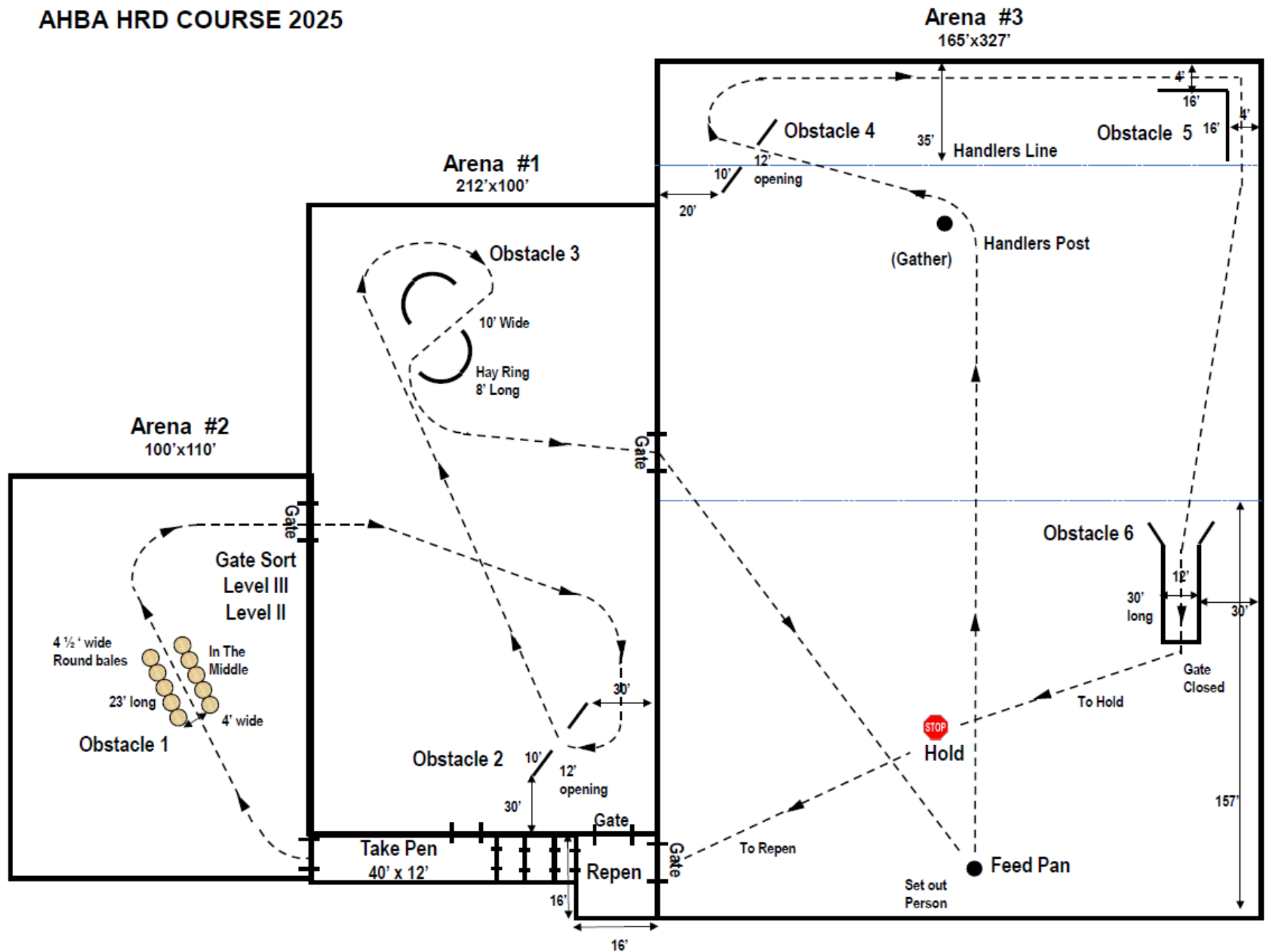
and may not go in the Chute Pen. Once stock are inside the obstacle, handlers will go to the opposite end to open gate to let out stock and then close gate. All Handlers can move to any position relative of the obstacle but may not enter the Chute Pen. Scoring for the Chute Pen ends after the last head of stock exit the obstacle and the gate is closed.

7. Hold: The animals are taken to the hold area which is approximately the middle of the bottom half of the arena. The stock are settled and briefly held in place. There is no required position for handler or dog. The judge signals the end of the hold/settle. HTAD I and II handlers then take the stock to the repen. HTAD III handlers proceed with the sort.

8. Gate Sort: The sort is done by HTAD III handlers only. The stock are taken to the Repen Gate. Any two animals are gate-sorted and repenned. Handlers shall not touch the sheep. A crook, hands or body can be used to block the sheep including use of their dog. Handler cannot shut the gate on a sheep. The sort ends when the gate is closed on the sorted animals.

9. Repen: The stock are taken to the repen and held a short distance off the gate while it is opened, and then are repenned. For the Gate Sort, the animals that had been left out in the arena are repenned. The run ends when the repen gate is closed after the last animal has exited the arena. Handlers may not enter the Repen.

AHBA HRD COURSE FALL 2025

DESCRIPTION

Tie Breakers: Best Take Pen, then best Obstacle 5, then Time, then best Obstacle 6

Course Time: 18 minutes

Time starts when the gate for the take pen is opened. The lead is removed before the handler opens the take pen gate except for HRD I handlers who may enter the pen on leash.

1. Take Pen: From the 40' x 12' take pen located to the back of the barn before the gate into Arena #1, stock are removed and headed into Arena #1 which is 212' x 100'. Open and close gate. HRD I handlers may enter the pen with their dog on leash if the handler chooses, but there must be a pause after the lead is removed before the dog is sent to collect the stock. Handler may move around to assist the dog as needed but may not touch the dog or stock without penalty. HRD II handlers may enter the pen but must remain just inside the gate while the dog moves the stock out of the pen. HRD III handlers may not enter the pen. HRD II and HRD III handlers must enter the pen off lead. Scoring for the Take Pen ends when the stock have exited and the gate is closed.

2. Obstacle 1 : Stock are moved to the northwest toward the 5 round bale double sided chute set at a diagonal with a 4' opening approximately 23' long set in the middle of the arena. Stock enter from the southeast side and go through chute heading northwest. All HRD handlers may not enter obstacle but can go up to the opening of the obstacle. Scoring ends when stock have cleared the Obstacle.

3. Arena #2 Gate & Sort: HRD III handlers will gate sort any 2 sheep into Arena #2. Close gate. Then reunite the remaining sheep into Arena #2 with the other sorted sheep and close gate. HRD II will gate sort any 1 sheep into Arena #2. Close gate and then reunite the remaining sheep into Arena #2 with the other sheep and close gate. HRD I handlers will open gate to Arena #2 and take the stock through the gate and then close the gate. Scoring ends when the gate is closed on the final time.

4. Obstacle 2: The stock are turned/driven in Arena #2 to the Southeast corner going **clockwise** around the top panel of the two panel obstacle and then turned to the right to move stock through the opening of the obstacle. Obstacle 2 is located in the Southeast corner set at a diagonal with the top edge of the panel set 30' west from the east fence. The second panel is in line to the first panel and the bottom edge is located 30' from the south fence. The opening is 12' wide. Scoring for Obstacle 2 ends when the stock have exited the Obstacle.

5. Obstacle 3: Hay Ring - Stock are moved to the Northwest corner and taken clockwise around the top side of the hay ring and then circled around to the right and then through the opening of the obstacle heading southwest. The two piece hay ring is set at a diagonal well off the northwest corner of the arena. The second piece of the Hay Ring is off set to the middle of the first piece. The opening is 10' wide and about 8' long for each piece. Scoring for Obstacle 3 ends when the stock have exited the Obstacle. Stock are then turned to the west gate to enter Arena #3. Open and close gate.

6. Arena #3 Gate to Feed Pan/Gather: All Handlers will move the stock through Arena #2 west side gate into Arena #3. Open and close all gates. Turn stock to the right or South in Arena #3 and set stock on feed pan 30' north of the South fence fetching or driving. Handlers proceed to Handler's cone at the mid-point of the Arena. Scoring ends when handlers reach the Handlers cone.

Gather: HRD III handler and dog start at the cone and handler remains at cone for the gather. HRD II handler sets dog at cone and handler may go halfway to the stock to send. HRD I handler's dog may be taken to a point halfway between the cone and the stock and then the handler can go to within 15 feet of the stock. Send dog and then stock are taken to right or east of cone then turning left around the back of the cone heading northwest toward Obstacle 4. Scoring ends when stock have cleared the back of the cone and have reached about 30' from Obstacle 4. HRD III remains at the cone for Obstacle 4.

7. Obstacle 4 & Wear/Drive: Stock are moved/driven to the left or west toward the two panel obstacle and moved through the opening of the freestanding panel that is 20' from the West fence at the bottom edge panel and set at a diagonal southwest to northeast. Stock are then turned to the right around the obstacle toward Obstacle 5. HRD III handlers remain at the handler's cone until stock exit the obstacle and can then move to the Handlers line. HRD II handlers may accompany the stock to the handler's line and then must remain along the line to drive the stock through the opening of the two panels. HRD I handlers may go up to the panel but cannot go through the opening of the panel. Scoring ends when the stock have turned right or East towards Obstacle 5.

8. Obstacle 5: The stock are turned/driven to the East to Obstacle 5 which is an L shaped obstacle and is located in the North East corner. The panel lengths are 16' long each and the alley is 4' wide. The stock are moved along the North fence and then turned/driven to the South to exit Obstacle 5. HRD III & HRD II handlers can move along and behind the Handlers line. HRD I handlers can move anywhere. Scoring for Obstacle 5 ends when the stock have exited the Obstacle.

9. Obstacle 6: The stock are turned south toward the Chute Pen Alley. Alleyway chute is located off the East fence, with the entrance built from the midpoint of the arena heading 30' south and 30' off the east side of the arena. The alleyway obstacle has a 12 ft. opening with two opposite wings at the entrance. A gate is attached and closed at the rear end of the Alleyway. The stock will enter the winged entrance of the obstacle moving the stock to the end of the chute to the closed gate. Handlers cannot go inside of obstacle. All Handlers can move to any position relative of the Chute and will go to end of obstacle and open gate and remove stock. Close gate after last animal has exited.

10. Stop and Hold Stock: Take stock to Stop Sign and settle stock and hold for a count of 12. Scoring then ends when stock are moved.

11. Repen: The stock are taken to the repen and held a short distance off the gate while the gate is being opened and then repenned.
