Starting time is 5:00 P.M. Please bring your own chair. We will have water available.

ABOUT JOY SEBASTIAN-HALL

Joy Hall has been involved in herding for over 25 years. She started with Texas Lacys working wild swamp cattle with relatives near the Old and Lost River in East Texas. She moved to Australian Cattle dogs and quieter cattle after she married, using them primarily for farm work and the occasional trial. She shifted to Border Collies and training for the public after a divorce forced the sale of the cattle operation.

The philosophy "Quality training makes quality dogs" is embraced by those who train with the Roux Crew. Roux Crew training has produced over 40 trialing champions and multiple HIT's (High In Trials) including the Australian Shepherd, Bearded Collie, Belgian Sheepdog, Belgian Tervuren, Cardigan Corgi, German Shepherd, and Pembroke Corgi National Specialties. She is proud to have helped train the winningest Schnauzer in the history of the breed, a dog that has won multiple HITs in all breed trials from the B course and the SSCA Herding Dog of the Year for four years in a row.

Students have won TSDA's Novice Dog of the Year, Ranch Dog of the Year, and the accompanying State titles. Many have gone on to be successful in the Nursery, Open Ranch and Open divisions.

Joy competes in several venues, AKC, AHBA, ASCA, and USBCHA and is a judge in all but ASCA. She strives to be fair, equitable and consistent in all venues and with all breeds.

She is married and lives on a working farm just west of Hempstead, TX. She raises commercial grass fed Dorpers, Nubians, and heritage ducks and geese. The farm produces grass fed beef, lamb, free range poultry and eggs, as well as a variety of cheeses. Her dogs are used daily in the operation of the farm as well as helping with herding lessons, pen work, set out, and trialing.

Directions from the Hotels in Burnet to trial site

Go North on Hwy. 281 and turn east on RR 963/County Road 200. Then take RR 963 north for approximately 10.5 miles. Turn right or south onto RR 1174 and go just over 1 mile and turn left onto County Road 210A. We are the second property on the right with the sign reading Destiny Farm on the gate.

RV Parking

1 electrical 30 amp hookups are available for \$15 per day. Three water hookups are also available. There will be no sewer dumping on the property. Please don't park in front of RV hookups as these are reserved for the RV's.

Directions to the Trial Site (From the east at IH 35 at Georgetown)

(Towns in order along Hwy. 29 heading west from Georgetown: Liberty Hill, Bertram, Burnet)

Take Hwy 29 to Bertram. In the middle of town at the only signal light, turn North (right) onto RR 243/RR1174 also called Grange Street. Go 4/10 of a mile and turn left onto RR 1174 North. Go 7.6 miles and turn right onto County Road 210A. Go 6/10 mile. The road curves to the left and then to the right. We are the second property on the right at 601 County Road 210A, Destiny Farm. **Please keep gate closed.**
